BOTHWELL FOUNDATION ELECTS OFFICERS

SEDALIA -- The Bothwell Regional Health Center Foundation recently elected a slate of seven officers to serve as board officers and the Executive Committee. Members of the Foundation Board's nominating committee selected the officers who will serve one-year terms.

David Floyd, Sedalia, vice president of Human Resources for Waterloo Industries, will remain as board president. Floyd was appointed to the foundation board in 2005 and is entering his fifth year as president.

David Callis, Sedalia, appointed to the foundation board in May, is vice president. Callis operates a family farm and carries on a family legacy. His grandfather, William Schien, was a member of the health center's Board of Trustees from 1948 to 1972.

- John Dawes, Bothwell Regional Health Center's president and CEO. Dawes has served on the foundation board since 2005.
- Mary McIntosh, Sedalia, appointed to the foundation board in May, will serve as an at-large representative. McIntosh formerly served as State Fair Community College's vice president for institutional advancement and executive director of SFCC's Foundation.
