All three students plan to pursue bachelor's degrees in biology or chemistry through various pre-med programs at Missouri universities.



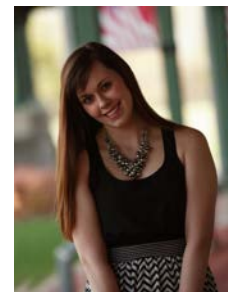
