organizations, such as Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York; the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn.; University of Missouri Health Care, Columbia; and Citizen's Memorial Hospital, Bolivar.

The nation's Most Wired hospitals are leveraging the adoption and use of health information technology to improve performance, according to Bothwell IT Director Tom Fairfax.

"Hospitals are focusing on expanding and adopting information technology while protecting patient data and optimizing patient flow and communications," said Fairfax.

The Most Wired recognition was earned through information submitted by Fairfax, whose vision and philosophy of IT as a service department has led to Bothwell's success as a Most Wired hospital for the third time.

Bothwell uses IT tools, including integrated lab systems, radiology filmless picture archiving and communications systems (PACS), bedside medication verification (BMV) and computerized provider order entry (CPOE) to name just a few, to help staff across the health center care for patients. Bothwell's dedicated IT staff, along with select individuals from other departments, works tirelessly with physicians to ensure that the IT systems meet the needs of our patients.

The nation's Most Wired hospitals, including Bothwell, use technology to check drug interactions and drug allergies when medications are ordered. This is a major step in reducing medication errors and improving patient safety.

"Bothwell has received national recognition for being ahead of the curve in the information technology systems we use to help ensure the safest and best possible patient care," said Bothwell President and CEO John Dawes. "We realize the value and leadership of our IT department and the teamwork of our clinical and support staff, and we are very proud of this achievement."

"I'm very proud of my team," echoed Fairfax. "I would be remiss to not also gratefully acknowledge the commitment of time and expertise provided by our physicians and other department staff in helping us improve the quality and safety of patient care."

The Most Wired list represents hospitals nationwide that scored the highest in a national survey. Bothwell was one of five hospitals recognized in Missouri.
